

USE OF CHANGING FACILITIES

Overview – LTA

The Policy is intended to allow venues to meet the needs of its members, taking into account the facilities that are available to them, the number of people accessing them and the activities they are undertaking.

Changing rooms and transgender people: Venues should consult the Equality and Human Rights Commission Guidance on the provision of single-sex spaces in making decisions in relation to changing room provision.

HALTON TENNIS CENTRE (HTC) - POLICY ON THE USE OF CHANGING ROOMS

HTC strives to ensure that all children (anyone under 18) are safeguarded from abuse and have an enjoyable tennis or other activity experience.

It recognises that HTC is open to the public and as such is unable to fully monitor usage of changing facilities.

Future site developments will include options to build a separate Under 18 changing facilities

In addition to general education and awareness, main protection is a combination of security cameras on site (26) and a significant DBS trained workforce (coaches and personal trainers)

This policy applies to all staff, coaches, volunteers, players, parents/carers and any other individuals associated with HTC

Acceptable use of our changing rooms.

1. Parents and Children will be advised that HTC changing facilities are used by both adults and children. It is recommended that children come ready changed for their activities, reducing the need for use of changing facilities. They should then change at home.
2. Mixed gender groups of children will have access to separate changing rooms.
3. Mobile phones and other electronic devices must not be used in changing rooms.
